A QUESTION TO PONDER:

3. Accept the gift - John 1:11-13 ~ it is just receiving what God has freely offered!
4. Confess (or declare) - Romans 10:8-11 ~ speak it, share it, live it!

God “saw our need”, so He “gave the Provision” of His Son as our substitute sacrifice . . . and He waits for a response. He is a good God!
