Context: In an effort to "save Jacob's life" Rebekah manipulates Isaac to send Jacob away to find a wife from her own family. Jacob, traveling with less than bare necessities, uses a rock for a pillow at his first "Motel-6" and dreams of a ladder with angels ascending to and descending from heaven - Jesus, standing at the top. The LORD establishes His covenant with Jacob to provide, care for and protect him on his journey and returning him to this land of promise. Jacob responds: Genesis 28:18-32
