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GOD is FAITHFUL!!! Wow! What a great time of reunion and now settling in Egypt ~ a time of plenty during the severe famine. A season of relative isolation such that a nation of millions would arise from a foundation of 70! Amidst the ever expanding "family" the identity of Hebrew or Israelite developed that would forever be a brand that the surrounding many would repulse and a distant few would recognize as a special, peculiar people to be embraced as "His-story" unfolds...

**Context:** Joseph, Pharaoh's #2 man, balances the demands upon his life: administration of all food distributions; personal family, extended family and all the needs. Yes, he delegates to servants and family members BUT he is no less intentional in <u>his</u> duties. A man of faith who has developed and embraced his Lord's unfolding plan as his stage for his administration . . . each person of faith, true faith, must adopt his personal life as <u>His</u> arena ~

Is it me or are we seeing a shift in Jacob's faith-walk.
