⁹⁷ How I love Your Law!

It is my meditation all the day.

⁹⁸ Your commandments make me wiser than my enemies,

For they are ever mine.

⁹⁹ I have more insight than all my teachers,
For Your testimonies are my meditation.

¹⁰⁰ I understand more than those who are old,
Because I have complied with Your precepts.

¹⁰¹ I have restrained my feet from every evil way,
So that I may keep Your word.

¹⁰² I have not turned aside from Your judgments,
For You Yourself have taught me.

¹⁰³ How sweet are Your words to my taste!

Yes, sweeter than honey to my mouth!

¹⁰⁴ From Your precepts I get understanding;
Therefore I hate every false way.

We recognize the psalmist has experienced the full treasure of the Word of God - circle the words he uses to describe it!
